PORTSMOUTH – The City of Portsmouth invites residents to attend a neighborhood meeting for the Concord & Porpoise Way Streetscape Improvement Project. The meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 25th at 7:00 p.m. in Conference Room A at Portsmouth City Hall. Residents of Concord & Porpoise Ways are urged to attend.

The City has contracted with Gorrill-Palmer Consulting Engineers of Gray, Maine to perform engineering and design services for the Concord & Porpoise Ways Streetscape Improvement Project. At this meeting, City staff and Gorrill-Palmer will present the draft final plan for the proposed improvements and answer questions.

Two previous neighborhood meetings were held to discuss the planned improvements as well as two on-site field days where residents were able to meet on-site with project engineers to discuss individual property owner concerns.

As with previous streetscape improvement projects in the neighborhood, this project will include replacement of sewer, water and drainage infrastructure as well as new curbing, street trees and sidewalks. The design for this project is funded through the City of Portsmouth's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Construction of the proposed improvements will be dependent upon funding availability.
