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A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A BOND ISSUE OF UP TO ONE MILLION SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,600,000) TO PAY FOR THE RECONSTRUCTING OF COMMERCE WAY, AND TO PAY FOR ALL COSTS INCIDENTAL AND RELATED THERETO.

BE IT RESOLVED:

THAT, the sum of **One Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars** (\$1,600,000) be and hereby is appropriated to pay costs of reconstructing Commerce Way, and for the payment of all costs incidental and related thereto.

THAT, to meet this appropriation, the City Treasurer, with the approval of the City Manager is authorized to borrow up to **One Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars** (\$1,600,000) through the issuance of bonds under and pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act or pursuant to any other enabling authority.

THAT, however, that no amounts shall be borrowed or expended in accordance with this order unless and until all right, title and interest in Commerce Way shall have been conveyed by its current owner or owners, to the City.

THAT the discretion of fixing the dates, maturities, rates of interest, forms and other details of such bonds is hereby delegated to the City Treasurer with the approval of the City Manager.

THAT the useful life of the Commerce Way improvements is determined to exceed twenty (20) years.

THAT in order to defray costs of reconstructing Commerce Way, the City is authorized to impose a Betterment Assessment upon property owners served by or abutting Commerce Way, in such amounts as shall be permitted by law.

PETITION FOR CONDITIONAL LAYOUT OF AN EXISTING PRIVATE RIGHT-OF-WAY KNOWN AS COMMERCE WAY, WITH BETTERMENT ASSESSMENTS, PURSUANT TO RSA 231:8 AND RSA 231:28-30

NOW COMES Commerce Way, LLC, a New Hampshire limited liability company, with a place of business at 210 Commerce Way, Suite 150, Portsmouth, New Hampshire 03801, which is the owner of a private right-of-way known as Commerce Way, as said roadway is specifically delineated on the plans and drawings appended hereto, which respectfully requests that the Portsmouth City Council layout Commerce Way as a Class V public roadway in the City of Portsmouth. Pursuant to the statute, Commerce Way, LLC hereby supplies the following materials to assist the Council in its consideration of the Petition:

- Exhibit 1. A street frontage exhibit of the improvement area of Commerce Way (to be supplied).
- Exhibit 2. An engineered plan of the improvements to Commerce Way prepared by Appledore Engineering of Portsmouth, NH. As noted on the plan, Commerce Way, as improved, will remain in its present location. Appledore Engineering's certification that the road to be constructed conforms to construction standards and requirements currently in effect in the City of Portsmouth is contained on Note 10 on Sheets R-3A and R-3B (to be supplied).
- Exhibit 3. The Roadway Improvement Plan Summary provides a narrative of the improvements which are delineated on the Appledore plan and summarizes improvements to be completed as part of the roadway upgrade.
- Exhibit 4A A legal description (4A) and survey (4B) (to be supplied) of the highway to be laid
- and 4B out and subsequently conveyed to the City of Portsmouth as prepared by McNeill, Taylor & Gallo, P.A., Attorneys at Law, 180 Locust Street, Dover, NH 03821, and Doucet Survey, Inc. of 102 Kent Place, Newmarket, NH 03857.
- Exhibit 5. A roadway improvement cost estimate by Appledore Engineering.

Exhibit 6. A list of all of the abutters to Commerce Way containing the percentage cost assessments, by street frontage, to be assessed against property owners who own developable property along Commerce Way.

Commerce Way, LLC respectfully submits that there is a public need for Commerce Way to be laid out as a Class V road in its present location. Commerce Way provides a commercial connection between the recently upgraded Portsmouth Boulevard and Woodbury Avenue. The private roadway presently services Commerce Center, an office park which was substantially developed during the period of 1983-84.

In order to effectively compete in the commercial office rental market, Commerce Way is in need of improvement and modernization. The owner proposes to reconstruct 2,550 linear feet of roadway to City of Portsmouth standards and construct a 5 foot pedestrian sidewalk to City of Portsmouth standards from Woodbury Avenue to Portsmouth Boulevard. In addition, the owner proposes to construct vertical granite curb to City of Portsmouth standards and to construct shoebox-style roadway light fixtures to match the existing fixtures on Portsmouth Boulevard. The owner will also construct 600 ft. of landscape median islands between the Kmart driveway and the north corner of Commerce Way for landscape enhancement and traffic calming. New landscaping including trees and shrubs along the perimeter of the entire roadway will be completed as well as the construction of pedestrian benches. The number of curb cuts will be reduced. Utilities will be improved and various waterline service improvements from Woodbury Avenue to the north corner of Commerce Way to create a continuous loop along the entire length of the roadway will be completed. Water main improvements, including 1,300 feet of 8" ducktail iron pipe with associated valves and fittings will also be completed.

All of the within improvements will not only improve the appearance, safety and sustainability of the roadway, but will also enhance the quality of the office center resulting in increased marketability and commercial vitality, and will facilitate the construction of the new building at 235 Commerce Way. The improvements will enhance the utility structures within the roadway, improve drainage, improve pedestrian safety and access, and provide an attractive new appearance for the Portsmouth Boulevard/Commerce Way loop to Woodbury Avenue. The improvements should result in the enhancement of the values of the properties which abut the roadway and should result in an increase in the values of the park which will result in greater taxable values to the City of Portsmouth.

It is proposed that the City pursuant to RSA 231:28-30, would bond the improvements for a ten-year term. The cost of the improvements will then be assessed proportionately against each developed property abutting Commerce Way based on its linear feet of road frontage in accordance with Exhibit 6. The assessment will be charged to each property owner, to be paid semi-annually over the bonding period of 10 years to

be secured by a statutory betterment assessment lien against the property of all of the abutting owners listed on Exhibit 6.

Pursuant to RSA 231:28, it is respectfully requested that the Council refer this matter to the Planning Board for a report and thereafter schedule a public hearing on the within Petition with appropriate public notice.

PROCEDURE FOR CONDITIONAL LAYOUT FOR EXISTING PRIVATE RIGHT-OF-WAY WITH BETTERMENT ASSESSMENT

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COMMERCE WAY, PORTSMOUTH, NEW HAMPSHIRE

231:28 Conditional Layout for Existing Private Rights-of-Way or Class VI Highways. -Whenever, pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, the selectmen receive a petition to lay out roads over existing private rights-of-way or to lay out a class V highway over an existing class VI highway and such private right-of-way or class VI highway does not conform to construction standards and requirements currently in effect in the town, the selectmen may conditionally lay out roads upon compliance with betterment assessments as provided in this section and in RSA 231:29-33. Prior to commencement of conditional layout, however, a public hearing shall be held, written notice of which shall be given by the appropriate governing board to all owners of property abutting or served by the private right-of-way or class VI highway, at least 14 days before the hearing, at which hearing details of the proposed construction, reconstruction or repairs, and the estimated costs thereof shall be presented by the selectmen. Conditional layout proceedings may commence 10 days following the public hearing unless within that period a petition not to conditionally lay out said thoroughfare signed by a majority of the owners of property abutting or served by the existing private right-of-way or class VI highway is received by the selectmen. If a highway is so laid out, the selectmen may construct reconstruct, repair or cause to be constructed, reconstructed or repaired such highways, streets, roads, or traveled ways to conform in every way with the highway or street construction standards and regulations previously established by the town. The betterment assessments shall be assessed under the provisions of RSA 231:29. (Emphasis supplied)

The following procedure must be followed:

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1. Petition for Conditional Layout to be Submitted by

- [X] The applicant must submit a Petition for Layout to the City Council pursuant to RSA 231:28. (the "Petition")
- [X] The Petition will be labeled "Petition for Conditional Layout of Existing Private Right-of-Way"; it does not require any unusual format but it must contain all of the items set forth in this checklist.
- [X] The submission of the Petition will include an engineered plan of Commerce Way, as improved by Appledore Engineering. Commerce Way, as improved, will remain in its present location.
- [X] Appledore must certify that the road to be constructed conforms to construction standards and requirements currently in effect in the City of Portsmouth.

[X] The Petition must set forth the Betterment Assessment to include:
	[X] A detailed cost of construction specification as certified by Appledore.
	[X] That the cost of the improvement will be assessed (the "Assessment") against each property abutting or served based on its linear feet of road frontage.
	[X] That the Assessment will be charged to each owner of property abutting or served by the new road over a period of ten (10) years.
	[X] That until paid in full, the Assessment shall constitute a lien against the property of all such owners.
[X	The Petition will include a legal description of the highway to be laid out. The legal description will be provided by McNeill, Taylor & Gallo. PA.
[X]	The Petition will contain a statement of the "public need for the road at that place." Such a statement will be part of the application.
[X]	The Petition will be accompanied by a List of Abutters. The applicant will provide a list of all abutters making specific reference to tax and map numbers and mailing addresses.
[X]	The Petition will be signed by the applicant.



ROADWAY IMPROVEMENT SUMMARY

Commerce Way
Portsmouth, New Hampshire
December 19, 2011

Commerce Way, LLC is proposing to upgrade Commerce Way to the City of Portsmouth roadway standards. Ownership of the private roadway will be turned over to the City of Portsmouth upon completion of construction and acceptance by the Department of Public Works (DPW). Design of this roadway has been coordinated with the DPW, Fire Department, Police Department and the existing utility service providers. Local approvals have been issued by the Conservation Commission for a Conditional Use Permit and by the Trees & Greenery Committee for landscaping improvements. In addition, a Minor Wetland Impact Permit has been issued by the NHDES Wetland Bureau. The following summarizes improvements to be completed as part of the roadway upgrade:

- Reconstruct 2,550 LF of roadway cross section to City of Portsmouth standards.
- Construct five (5) foot concrete pedestrian sidewalk to City of Portsmouth standards from Woodbury Avenue to Portsmouth Boulevard.
- Construct vertical granite curb to City of Portsmouth standard.
- Construct shoe-box style roadway light fixtures to match the existing fixtures on Portsmouth Boulevard.
- Construct 600 feet landscaped median-island between the Kmart driveway and north corner of Commerce Way for landscape enhancement and traffic calming.
- Construct landscaping including new trees and shrubs along the perimeter of the entire roadway.
- · Construct new pedestrian benches.
- Reconstruct existing forty (40) foot turning radius at the north corner of Commerce Way to a seventy-five (75) foot turning radius to improve traffic safety. Associated site improvements include a proposed retaining wall and guardrail.
- Construct traffic signs and traffic pavement markings for all lane lines, shoulders, center islands, legends, stop bars, directional arrows and crosswalks.
- Construct public transportation shelter.
- Reduce the number of curb cuts on the north side of Commerce Way by consolidating driveways.
 Consolidated driveways will create additional landscaped areas and improve driveway traffic flow at these driveway intersections.
- Construct improved closed drainage system including new catch basins equipped with deep sump catch basins and oil/gas separator hoods, drainage pipe and under drains.
- Construct water service improvements from Woodbury Avenue to the north corner of Commerce
 Way to create a continuous loop along the entire length of roadway. The existing water main begins
 at Portsmouth Boulevard and dead ends at the north corner of Commerce Way. Water main
 improvements include the 1,300 feet of eight (8) inch ductile iron pipe with associated valves and
 fittings.
- Remove an existing crushed 8 inch clay sewer pipe located in Commerce Way and construct an 8 inch SDR 35 PVC pipe (exact limits of crushed pipe to be verified in field and coordinated with DPW).
- Shim the existing pavement on Portsmouth Boulevard and construct a 1.5 inch overlay from the Market Street Connector intersection to the proposed Portsmouth Boulevard driveway for 235 Commerce Way (per previous Site Review approval for 235 Commerce Way).
- Remove an existing crushed 8 inch clay sewer pipe located in Portsmouth Boulevard and construct 280 LF of 8 inch SDR 35 PVC pipe (per previous Site Review approval for 235 Commerce Way).

TITLE XX TRANSPORTATION

CHAPTER 231 CITIES, TOWNS AND VILLAGE DISTRICT HIGHWAYS

Laying Out Highways

Section 231:28

231:28 Conditional Layout for Existing Private Rights-of-Way or Class VI Highways. -

Whenever, pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, the selectmen receive a petition to lay out roads over existing private rights-of-way or to lay out a class V highway over an existing class VI highway and such private right-of-way or class VI highway does not conform to construction standards and requirements currently in effect in the town, the selectmen may conditionally lay out roads upon compliance with betterment assessments as provided in this section and in RSA 231:29-33. Prior to commencement of conditional layout, however, a public hearing shall be held, written notice of which shall be given by the appropriate governing board to all owners of property abutting or served by the private right-of-way or class VI highway, at least 14 days before the hearing, at which hearing details of the proposed construction, reconstruction or repairs, and the estimated costs thereof shall be presented by the selectmen. Conditional layout proceedings may commence 10 days following the public hearing

unless within that period a petition not to conditionally lay out said thoroughfare signed by a majority of the owners of property abutting or served by the existing private right-of-way or class VI highway is received by the selectmen. If a highway is so laid out, the selectmen may construct, reconstruct, repair or cause to be constructed, reconstructed or repaired such highways, streets, roads, or traveled ways to conform in every way with the highway or street construction standards and regulations previously established by the town. The betterment assessments shall be assessed under the provisions of RSA 231:29.

Section 231:29

231:29 Betterment Assessments Against Abutters and Those Served. – The cost of constructing, reconstructing or repairing such highways, streets, roads or traveled ways shall be assessed by the selectmen against the owners of property abutting or served by such facilities in an amount not exceeding the entire cost of constructing, reconstructing or repairing the same, and the amount so assessed upon each such owner shall be reasonable and proportional to the benefits accruing to the land served. Said assessments may be payable in one year or payment may be prorated over a period not to exceed 10 years, in the discretion of the appropriate governing board. All such assessments thus made shall be valid and binding upon the owners of land so abutting or served by these betterments.

Section 231:30

231:30 Liens for Assessments. – All assessments made under the provisions of RSA 231:29 shall create a lien upon the lands on account of which they are made, which shall continue following the assessment until fully discharged in accordance with the terms set by each governing board or in compliance with any court judgment. Such assessments shall be subject to interest and such other charges as are applicable to the collection of delinquent taxes.

Section 231:31

231:31 Collection of Assessments. – Betterment assessments authorized under RSA 231:29 shall be committed to the collector of tax with a warrant under the hands and seal of the appropriate governing board requiring him to collect them; and he shall have the same rights, authority and remedies and be subject to the same liabilities in relation thereto as in the collection of taxes.

231:32 Abatement and Appeal of Betterment Assessments. -


- I. Any person aggrieved by a betterment assessment made pursuant to RSA 231:29 may, within 2 months of the notice of tax date and not afterwards, apply in writing to the selectmen or assessors for an abatement of the betterment assessment.
- II. Upon receipt of an application under paragraph I, the selectmen or assessors shall review the application and shall grant or deny the application in writing within 6 months after the notice of tax date.
- III. (a) If the selectmen or assessors neglect or refuse to abate the betterment assessment, any person aggrieved may either:
 - (1) Appeal in writing to the board of tax and land appeals, upon payment of a \$65 filing fee; or
 - (2) Petition the superior court in the county where the property is located.
- (b) The appeal to either the board of tax and land appeals or superior court shall be filed within 8 months of the notice of tax date and not afterwards.
- IV. For purposes of this section, ""notice of tax date" means the date the taxing jurisdiction mails the betterment assessment tax bill.
 - V. Each betterment assessment tax bill shall require a separate abatement request and appeal.

231:33 Repair and Maintenance. – After the betterments authorized by RSA 231:28 have been completed by a town, the highway agent or other duly authorized official under the direction of the selectmen shall have charge of all further repair and maintenance of such highways, streets, roads and traveled ways, and such highways shall be maintained, repaired and reconstructed by the town in which they are located without further assessment of the owners of property abutting or served by said facilities.



Items Which Require Action Under Other Sections of the Agenda:

- 1. First Reading of Proposed Resolution and Ordinance Amendments:
 - 1.1 Acceptance of Petition and First Reading of a Resolution Authorizing a Bond Issue of up to \$1.6 Million Dollars (\$1,600,000) To Pay For The Reconstructing Of Commerce Way, And To Pay For All Costs Incidental And Related Thereto.

 As you are aware, the City conducted a public hearing on the petition from Commerce Way LLC for a Conditional Road Layout and Betterment Assessment in accordance with the process described in RSA 231:28 Conditional Layout for Existing Private Rights of Way at the August 20, 2012 City Council meeting.

The Conditional Layout for Existing Private Rights of Way and Betterment Assessments Against Abutters and Those Served, is a mechanism by which the cost of improvements to a private roadway is financed by a general obligation bond issued by the city and repaid by assessments on the private property owners served by the road (in this case, the building owners along Commerce Way). 100% of the bond and road improvement costs are paid by abutting property owners. Security for the bond repayment is in the form of liens against the abutting properties which have the same status as a property tax lien.

RSA 231:28 requires a ten day period following the public hearing, in which abutters or those served by the road may object to the process. If a majority of abutters do not object, the City Council accepts the Petition and moves forward with the standard

process to issue a general obligation bond. After this step is completed, the City proceeds with solicitation of bids and the construction of the proposed road improvements. At an appropriate time, the road will be conveyed by deed to the City and will become a city street.

The ten day period has now expired and there have been no petitions against layout of the road and completion of the betterment assessment. Therefore, the City is now able to accept the Petition from Commerce Way LLC for a Conditional Road Layout and Betterment Assessment and begin the bond resolution process (see Petition for Conditional Layout of an Existing Private Right-of-Way known as Commerce Way, With Betterment Assessments, Pursuant to RSA 231:8 and RSA 231:28-30).

In accordance with the process described above, I am bringing forward for first reading the attached proposed Resolution authorizing the Bonding of up to \$1.6 million dollars (\$1,600,000) to pay for the reconstructing of Commerce Way, and to pay for all costs incidental and related thereto.

I would recommend the City Council move the following two motions:

- 1) Move to accept the Petition from Commerce Way LLC for a Conditional Road Layout and Betterment Assessment, and
- 2) Move to pass first reading and schedule a public hearing and adoption of the proposed bonding resolution as presented at the September 17th City Council meeting. Action on this item should take place under Section IX of the Agenda.

2. Public Hearing/Second Reading Proposed Resolution and Ordinance Amendments:

Public Hearing/Second Reading of Proposed Ordinance Amendment to Chapter 7, Article III, Section 7.330 – No Parking – Tanner Court. As a result of the August 20th City Council meeting, under Section VII of the Agenda, I am bringing back for public hearing and second reading the attached proposed Ordinance Amendment to Chapter 7, Article III, Section 7.330 – No Parking – Tanner Court. As you are aware, the Parking and Traffic Safety Committee recommended this proposed Ordinance amendment in their minutes of May 10, 2012. This ordinance would make parking adjustments on Tanner Court made necessary by the redevelopment project at 51 Islington Street.

I would recommend the City Council move to pass second reading and schedule third and final reading of the proposed Ordinance amendment, as presented, at the September 17, 2012 City Council meeting. Action on this matter should take place under Section IX of the Agenda.

Consent Agenda:

- 1. Request for Licenses to install Projecting Signs. Attached under Section X of the Agenda are the following requests for projecting sign licenses (see attached memorandums from Rick Taintor, Planning Director):
 - Jessica Todd, owner of Jessica Todd Salon for property located at 33 Deer Street
 - Carla Kienzle, owner of Ten Thousand Villages for property located at 87 Congress Street
 - Ed Szczepanik, owner of Alex & Ani, for property located at 104 Congress Street

I would recommend the City Council move to approve the aforementioned Projecting Sign Licenses as recommended by the Planning Director and, further, authorize the City Manager to execute License Agreements for these requests. Action on this matter should take place under Section X of the Agenda.

2. <u>Acceptance of Donation to the Coalition Legal Fund.</u> The City has received a check from the Town of Rye in the amount of \$5,000.00 donating funds to the Coalition Legal Fund, which will be utilized to continue our fight to eliminate the statewide property tax.

I would recommend the City Council move to approve and accept the donation, as listed, to be placed in the Coalition Legal Fund. Action on this matter should take place under Section X of the Agenda.

City Manager's Items Which Require Action:

1. Approval of Proposed Employment Agreement for Deputy Chief of Police Corey MacDonald. The Portsmouth Police Commission has reached an agreement (see attached) with Corey MacDonald to serve as the Deputy Police Chief. The contract is for a five (5) year term, with a starting salary of Grade 24, Step C which is \$91,956 on the City's Wage/Salary Schedule for Non-Union Employees.

I would recommend that the City Council approve the Employment Agreement between Corey MacDonald and the Portsmouth Board of Police Commissioners for a 5-year term commencing on September 1, 2012 and ending on August 31, 2017.

2. Proposed Agreement between Trustees of the Trust Fund and Prescott Park Arts Festival. Attached is a proposed operating Agreement between the Trustees of the Trust Fund and the Prescott Park Arts Festival, which needs to be ratified by the City Council. Robert Sullivan, City Attorney, will answer any questions the City Council may have regarding this matter.

I would recommend the City Council move to ratify the operating Agreement between the Trustees of the Trust Fund and the Prescott Park Arts Festival, as presented.

3. Request for First Reading of Proposed Bonding Resolutions Re: Citywide and School Facilities Improvements. I am requesting that the City Council authorize the City Manager to bring back for first reading at your September 17th City Council meeting the attached Bonding Resolutions of up to Two Million Seven Hundred Sixty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$2,767,000) for the FY 2013 – 2018 Capital Improvement Projects. The following list identifies two separate resolutions:

a) Resolution for Bond Authorization of up to \$2,267,000 for FY13 Citywide, Bridge, Street and Sidewalk Improvements.

Downtown Sidewalk Replacement Program

\$700,000.00

This project involves the replacement of the sidewalks on Daniel Street from Market Square to the Wright Avenue Parking Lot. The existing sidewalks are made of concrete, asphalt and brick in some locations and are in poor condition due to wear and tear and age. Work will include resetting of granite curbing, new brick walking surface, period lighting and landscaping where appropriate. This project will tie together similar work previously completed on adjoining streets.

Sagamore Creek Bridge Replacement

\$367,000.00

This project involves funding the construction of the replacement of the Sagamore Creek Bridge on Rte 1A. Included with the bridge replacement is the reconstruction of the roadway approaches from Shaw Road to Rte 1B/Rte 1A intersection. Current schedule has project bidding in May-June 2013 with actual construction starting August 2013 through November 2014. Funding requested is for matching funds for federal/state grants.

• McDonough Street Area Improvements Project

\$400,000.00

This project is at the request of the Neighborhood Association to have new sidewalks and traffic calming measures installed throughout the McDonough Street Area, and it provides funding for Phase 3 of the project. The main purpose of this project is to enhance safety for the residents and others who travel through this area on foot, by bicycle or motor vehicle. The work includes water, sewer, storm drainage, paving, curbing, sidewalks and associated landscaping.

• Aldrich Road Traffic Safety Improvements

\$300,000.00

Aldrich Road has been identified as a high traffic connector between Middle Street and Islington Street which are both major arterial streets. This project is to construct traffic calming methods such as curbing, reduction of travel widths and intersection realignment. These improvements will slow traffic speeds, discourage through traffic and increase pedestrian safety in the corridor.

Pease International Tradeport Roadway Rehabilitation \$500,000.00

Per the Municipal Services Agreement between the City and the Pease Development Authority, the City shall provide Public Works services in the non-airfield area of the Tradeport. These services include maintaining and repairing roads, streets and sidewalks. These funds will provide for rehabilitation of roadway infrastructure within the Tradeport similar to the program conducted upon the roadway system in the remaining sections of the City.

- b) Resolution for Bond Authorization of up to \$500,000 for FY13 for School Facilities Improvements: The School Department has maintenance responsibilities for seven buildings with over 600,000 square feet of space. These funds will be utilized for the following facility upgrades:
 - Replacement of the older sections of the high school roof, not replaced under previous projects, which are now leaking.
 - Elementary school computer lab building infrastructure improvements to keep pace with newer technology upgrades.
 - Replacement of the existing boiler at New Franklin School with a new energy efficient model providing a healthier student environment and energy savings.

I would recommend that the City Council move the following motions:

- 1) Authorize the City Manager to bring back for first reading a Bond Resolution for Citywide Improvements in the amount of up to \$2,267,000 at the September 17, 2012 City Council meeting.
- 2) Authorize the City Manager to bring back for first reading a Bond Resolution for School Facilities Improvements in the amount of up to \$500,000 at the September 17, 2012 City Council meeting.

Please note that Bonding Resolutions require two readings and a public hearing and twothirds vote of the City Council.

4. **Proposed Expansion of the Downtown Overlay District.** As you will recall, at the July 16th meeting I presented a proposal from the Planning Board to amend the Zoning Map to expand the Downtown Overlay District (DOD). At that meeting, the Council raised several concerns about the inclusion of certain parcels in the DOD and referred this back to staff to respond to those concerns and make any appropriate changes. At the August 6th meeting, the Council voted to postpone consideration of first reading to September 4th in order to give staff sufficient time to address these issues.

In that additional staff time is needed to complete the additional work, and the Council has referred to the Planning Board a smaller expansion of the DOD to include just the Cityowned parcel at 143 Daniel Street, it is recommended that further consideration of the larger DOD expansion be deferred until after the rezoning and disposition of 143 Daniel Street has been completed.

Therefore, I would ask that the Council postpone consideration of this matter until after action has been taken on the separate proposal for rezoning of 143 Daniel Street.

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

Corey F. MacDonald and the Portsmouth Board of Police Commissioners September 1, 2012 to August 31, 2017

1. Preamble

This Agreement is entered into between the Board of Police Commissioners, City of Portsmouth, New Hampshire (hereinafter called "Commission/Board") and Corey F. MacDonald (hereinafter called "Employee"). This Agreement is null and void unless approved by the Portsmouth City Council.

2. Employment and Term

The Commission/Board agrees to employ the Employee and the Employee agrees to accept employment in the position of Deputy Police Chief for a 5-year term commencing on September 1, 2012 and ending on the August 31, 2017. The Commission/Board and the Employee acknowledge that this is a full-time, year-round position including extensive obligations in the evenings and on week-ends. The Employee agrees to devote sufficient professional effort to ensure the successful fulfillment of all his responsibilities to the Commission/Board and the City as Deputy Police Chief. In the event that the Employee's outside legal employment results in his involvement in any matter that the Commission/Board determines unduly interferes with his ability to devote sufficient professional effort to successfully fulfill all of his responsibilities to the Commission/Board and the City as Deputy Police Chief, the Commission/Board will provide the Employee with written notice and a thirty (30) day opportunity to cure. If the Employee fails to cure, the Commission/Board may proceed to terminate for cause consistent with the provisions of paragraph 5 below.

Salary

Effective September 1, 2012, the Employee shall receive a salary of ninety one thousand nine hundred and fifty six dollars (\$91,956) per annum, payable in no fewer than twenty-four installments and subject to such deductions as may be authorized or as may be required by law. See grade 24, step C of City's Wage/Salary Schedule for Non-Union Employees. The Employee shall not be entitled to any salary enhancements except as specifically provided herein.

COLA ADJUSTMENTS. On July 1, 2013 and on each July 1st thereafter during the term of the Agreement, a COLA adjustment percentage increase shall be computed which shall not be less than 2% nor more than 5%. The COLA Adjustment percentage shall be determined by taking the 10 year average of the CPI-U for the Boston-Brockton-Nashua—MA-NH-ME-CT all items index as computed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the US Department of Labor for the most recent 10 calendar years preceding the July 1 adjustment. BLS's calendar year for this index is November through November (it is not published on a December to December basis).

The reference base is 1982-1983 equals 100 until BLS updates the reference base at which time the parties agree to adopt the official reference base as used by BLS.

STEP INCREMENTS. On July 1, 2013 and on each July 1st thereafter during the term of the Agreement (unless the Employee has already reached the top step of the Wage/Salary Schedule), the Employee is eligible to move up one (1) step on the Schedule.

4. Certification

The Employee shall be required to hold for the life of this Agreement a valid certificate, properly registered and issued by the State of New Hampshire, as follows: New Hampshire Certified Police Officer.

5. Termination for Cause

This Agreement may be terminated by the Commission/Board at any time for cause, i.e., failure on the part of the Employee to comply with any term or condition of this Agreement, the laws, rules and regulations of the State of New Hampshire, or the rules and regulations of the Commission/Board, or the City of Portsmouth; or malfeasance, misfeasance, nonfeasance, or insubordination in carrying out the responsibilities of the position as specified in the Municipal Charter of the City of Portsmouth or as directed by the Commission/Board.

Termination for Cause shall take place only following written notification specifying the reasons for termination. Unless the Employee submits to the Commission/Board, within twenty (20) days of receipt of such notification, a written request for a hearing before the Commission/Board, the Agreement shall be considered terminated as of the date which falls thirty (30) days after the Employee's receipt of notification. If the Employee requests a hearing, the Commission/Board shall hold this hearing within twenty (20) days after receipt of such request. The Commission/Board shall render a written decision to the Employee within ten (10) days of the hearing. In the event of a Termination for Cause, the Employee shall receive no severance and no further compensation beyond the last day worked.

6. <u>Termination with Severance Payment or Reassignment</u>

If at any time the Commission/Board in its discretion shall so determine, the Commission/Board may, without cause and with or without prior notice, relieve the Employee of his duties under this Agreement. In such event, the Employee shall be entitled to severance benefits. Such severance benefits shall be six (6) month's salary or the balance of the contract, whichever is less. As is set forth above in Section 5, if the termination is for cause, the Employee shall not be entitled to severance benefits. Severance benefits shall not be paid upon the voluntary resignation of the Employee.

In the event that the position of Deputy Police Chief is eliminated, or if the Employee's employment as Deputy Police Chief is terminated for reasons other than for cause or voluntary resignation, in heu of receiving any severance benefits, the

Employee may opt for reassignment to another position in the Portsmouth Police Department, such position to be selected by the Chief of Police at his/her sole discretion, provided that the Employee will also be returned to the level of compensation and benefits he was earning immediately prior to the execution of this contract.

7. Termination by Mutual Consent/Voluntary Resignation

This Agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual consent of the Commission/Board and the Employee or by voluntary resignation of the Employee. In the event the Employee voluntarily resigns before the expiration of the term of this Agreement or any renewal thereof, the Employee shall give the Commission/Board sixty (60) days written notice in advance of such resignation. In the event of voluntary resignation, the Employee shall not be eligible for severance benefits pursuant to Section 6 of this Agreement.

8. Severance Constitutes Release

The acceptance by the Employee of the severance benefits provided under this Agreement shall constitute a full and complete release of any other rights, claims, or causes of action whether in law, equity or otherwise, that the Employee may have against the Commission/Board, the City of Portsmouth, and the employees, elected or appointed officials, officers, agents, representatives and attorneys of such entities.

9. Benefits

Except as otherwise provided herein, the Employee's fringe benefits shall be established by the collective bargaining agreement between the City of Portsmouth and the Professional Management Association. The exceptions shall be described in detail in Section 10 below.

10. Exception to Benefits in Section 9

In addition to the compensation enumerated above, the Employee shall also be entitled to the following:

- a. The Deputy Police Chief shall be provided with a suitable automobile for use in the performance of his duties under this Agreement. Recognizing that the Deputy Police Chief is on-call at all times, it is understood that the automobile may also be used for personal business.
- As a condition of employment, the employee shall be domiciled within a thirty (30) mile radius of the Portsmouth Police Department and shall remain domiciled within that radius during the term of employment.

The parties below acknowledge that this Agreement is subject to the approval of the Portsmouth City Council without which approval this Agreement is without force and effect.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS OF THE CITY OF PORTSMOUTH AND THE PRESCOTT PARK ARTS FESTIVAL

This agreement is entered into between the Trustees of Trust Funds (hereinafter "Trustees") of the City of Portsmouth, with a principal place of business at Water Street, Portsmouth, New Hampshire and a mailing address at P.O. Box 1103, Portsmouth New Hampshire 03802-1103 and the Prescott Park Arts Festival (hereinafter "PPAF") with a principal place of business at Portsmouth, New Hampshire and a mailing address at P.O. Box 4370, Portsmouth New Hampshire 03802-4370.

WHEREAS, the Trustees, operating under the authority of the Portsmouth City

Council, administer the operation of Prescott Park (hereinafter "the Park") located on Marcy

Street in the City of Portsmouth; and

WHEREAS the Trustees desire to have PPAF direct artistic and cultural events in the Park on behalf of the Trustees and the City; and

WHEREAS, the Trustees desire to engage the services of PPAF for the purposes contained herein; and

WHEREAS, PPAF desires to perform the services described herein;

NOW THEN the Trustees and PPAF agree as follows:

PERFORMANCES

- 1. During the term of this agreement PPAF shall be the sole entity provided with authority from the Trustees to schedule performances or cultural events within the Park and on the stage located within the Park.
- 2. At least 14 (fourteen) days prior to the scheduling of any performance or cultural event in the Park or on the stage, PPAF shall provide the Trustees and the Park Supervisor with written notice of the event to be scheduled, and the Trustees and the Park Supervisor shall have the complete authority to determine whether or not such performance shall occur. PPAF shall provide one (1) notice of the combined series of events collectively called "The Prescott Park Arts Festival", which notice shall be provided to the Trustees and the Park

Supervisor at least ninety (90) days before the commencement of the first event. PPAF shall not advertise for any event until that event has been approved by the Trustees and the Park Supervisor.

- 3. It is anticipated by this agreement that PPAF shall schedule the following types of performances and cultural events:
 - a. Musical concerts
 - b. Theater performances
 - c. Dance performances
 - d. Theater classes
 - e. Up to three food festivals located within the Park as approved by the Trustees and the Park Supervisor
 - f. Movies
 - g. Such other performances or uses of the stage as may be authorized by the Trustees and the Park Supervisor.

THE STAGE

- 4. PPAF understands that the stage located in the Park is not a forum for public expression, but rather is strictly limited in use to artistic performances and cultural presentations as authorized by the Trustees and the Park Supervisor.
- 5. As such the stage may not be used by any party for any purpose other than as expressly authorized by the Trustees and the Park Supervisor.
- No advertising or signage of any kind shall be placed on or near the stage, or the outside perimeter of the Park (lawns, fences et cetera) without specific authorization by the Trustees and the Park Supervisor.
- 7. All stage set construction shall be done in accordance with applicable municipal codes (e.g., electrical) and be subject to inspection by municipal inspectors.
- 8. At all times PPAF shall maintain the stage site in a clean and safe condition and subsequent to the end of "The Prescott Park Arts Festival", PPAF shall remove all site construction, remove all trailers, tents and leave the stage site in a clean and safe condition, and all the foregoing to be done all in a timely manner.
- All vehicle loading and unloading, including materials, equipment, costumes, musicians instruments et cetera will be done to the rear of the stage from the parking lot, unless specific approval is given by the Park Superintendent.
- 10. PPAF shall maintain clear access in the vicinity of the stage during all performances sufficient for police vehicle or ambulance use.

THE PARK

- 11. PPAF recognizes the policy that the Park is to be maintained at all times as a place where members of the public may enjoy its use without charge. Except as expressly authorized by the Trustees and the Park Supervisor no money may be collected from anyone for any purpose within the Park.
- 12. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Trustees authorize PPAF to solicit donations from the public. However, such donations must be collected in a manner, by signage or otherwise, which clearly informs the donors that their contribution is voluntary. Public access to and through the Park should not be hindered or restricted by gates, ropes or obstructions of any kind which prevent the public from utilizing the normal pathways through the Park or the fenced perimeter of the Park.
- PPAF is not authorized to allow the placement of any signs or advertising anywhere within the Park without the prior express written approval of the Trustees and the Park Supervisor.
- 14. PPAF shall use best efforts to assist Park personnel in enforcing the rules of the Park, (e.g., no alcohol, no dogs, no outside vendors or soliciting, and no public expression outside of the public forum areas).

CONCESSION STAND

- 15. The Trustees authorize PPAF to operate the concession stand within the Park and to sell food and merchandise at that location. PPAF shall have the authority to determine what items are to be sold at that concession stand and what amount is to be charged for the sale of such items. All concession stand revenues shall remain with PPAF.
- 16. PPAF shall at all times during its events maintain the concession stand and the area surrounding it in a clean and safe condition and shall keep the bathrooms in a clean condition with bathroom items stocked. The concession stand and bathrooms shall be secured when not in use. The obligations under this provision shall apply whenever the concession stand is utilized by either PPAF or any entity operating under the authority of PPAF.
- 17. The concession stand shall be operated under such terms and conditions as may be established by the City Council, City Manager or the Trustees.

PROPERTY TO BE USED AND OCCUPIED BY PPAF

- 18. In the performance of its responsibilities under this agreement, PPAF shall have the right, in conjunction with the Trustees, to use and occupy the following properties;
 - a. The Concession Stand
 - b. The Stage (as limited by this agreement)
 - The third floor of the Shaw Building, which may be used for the storage of items related to artistic performances.
 - d. The second floor offices located in the Shaw Building used by PPAF at the time that this agreement is entered.
 - e. Four trailers behind the main stage for storage purposes in support of artistic performances which might occur on the stage.
 - f. Temporary structures in the vicinity of the stage in order to accommodate dressing rooms, the storage of materials and storage of equipment related to performances which may occur on stage.
 - g. A trailer behind the concession stand for food storage purposes.
 - h. The first and second floor of the Sheafe Warehouse.
 - i. The sound building.
 - j. The newly constructed support building scheduled for occupancy in June 2012 (see building permit #: 2011-00820).
 - k. The 4' x 4' storage building.
 - The existing deck of approximately 20' x 100' located next to the merchandise which may be used by PPAF for paid reserved seating purposes.

All property used or occupied by PPAF shall be kept in a clean, neat and sanitary condition at all times.

- 19. Each year the Trustees and PPAF shall conduct good faith negotiations to address shared park operating costs. For purposes of this provision the term park operating costs shall mean:
 - a. Direct occupancy costs paid by Trustees, such as utilities, repairs and maintenance attributable to PPAF.
 - b. Indirect costs paid by Trustees as a result of crowds brought to the park by PPAF, such as consumable supplies, repairs and maintenance to park property and utility consumption.
 - c. Park staff time required to support PPAF activities.

OTHER PPAF ACTIVITIES

- 20. Beyond artistic performance, PPAF is specifically authorized to perform the following functions at such dates, times and place as may be approved by the Trustees and the Park Supervisor:
 - a. PPAF may conduct a juried art show on the ground floor of the Sheafe Warehouse in conjunction with the New Hampshire Art Association.
 - b. PPAF may conduct a one day art exhibit outdoors in the Park.
 - c. PPAF may conduct a Chili Festival, which may include a participation fee
 - d. PPAF may conduct a Chowder Festival, which may include a participation fee.
 - e. In conjunction with the Friends of the South End (FOSE) PPAF may conduct the so-called "Fairy House Tours".

TERM

21. The term of this agreement shall commence upon its completed execution and be automatically renewed, on a year to year basis, unless amended by the parties. Either party may terminate this agreement without cause by providing sixty (60) days notice to the other party.

INSURANCE AND FINANCES

- 22. PPAF shall maintain at all times during the term of this agreement general liability insurance in a coverage amount of at least \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence naming the City of Portsmouth and the Trustees of Trust Funds as additional insureds, certificates indicating the existence of such insurance shall be kept on file at all times in the office of the City Attorney of the City of Portsmouth.
- 23. Financial Books and records of PPAF shall be open for review at all times by the Trustees upon reasonable notice to PPAF.
- 24. At any time during the term of this agreement on request of the Trustees PPAF shall provide the Trustees with a full accounting of all income and expense, including donations, sponsorships, and income of any form received by PPAF for the prior calendar year.
- 25. PPAF shall adopt a cash handling policy meeting the approval of the Trustees, which policy shall be in place prior to the commencement of the summer of 2009 performances, and which policy shall not be modified or amended without the written approval of the Trustees.

26. At the close of the performance season, PPAF shall provide the Trustees with complete annual financial statements reflecting all financial activities of PPAF.

MISCELLANEOUS

- 27. PPAF recognizes that the Trustees and Park management schedule use of the Park for weddings, dock reservations, public forum area events and Four Tree Island events and PPAF shall make whatever reasonable accommodations are necessary to allow those scheduled items to occur without interference.
- 28. Neither this agreement nor any of the authority granted under it shall be transferrable or assignable in any way by PPAF.
- 29. This agreement may be terminated by the Trustees at any time it is determined by the Trustees in the exercise of reasonable judgment that PPAF has operated in breach of its terms.
- 30. This agreement describes the entire relationship between the Trustees, the Park Supervisor and PPAF. PPAF shall have no authority to conduct any activity not specifically authorized herein.
- 31. In interpretation of this agreement the parties recognize that the Trustees and the Park Supervisor authorize PPAF to operate during the currently scheduled season in a manner generally consistent with the operation of PPAF in past seasons.
- 32. PPAF understands that the Park Supervisor represents the Trustees in all matters connected with the Park and with the administration of this agreement and that he/she speaks with the authority of the Trustees on these matters. To facilitate communication the Executive Director or his/her designee of PPAF and the Park Supervisor shall hold weekly meetings during the summer season of PPAF and other meetings to be scheduled on the call of the Park Supervisor for the purpose of addressing any issues of concern to either PPAF or the Park Supervisor.
- 33. Every year, prior to the commencement of summer activities by PPAF, there shall be a meeting held between the full Board of Directors of PPAF and the Trustees of Trust Funds for the purpose of considering all matters of mutual concern.

Chairman Eaton opened the meeting at 7:35 AM and thanked Novocure Chief Operating Officer (COO) Mike Ambrogi for hosting the meeting.

Approval of draft meeting minutes

Following a motion by Commissioner DeStefano and a second by Commissioner Cyr, the draft meeting minutes of May 4, 2012 were unanimously approved as written.

Old Business

Parking Omnibus Update

The City Council will conduct a work session on June 18, 2012 at 6:30 PM on the parking strategies included in the parking omnibus. Because it is a work session, there will be no opportunity for public comment or input from Board and Commissioners. It can be viewed in person, on Channel 22 or online. A copy of the final strategy report will be provided to the EDC when available.

City Council action on Heritage and Constitution Economic Revitalization Zone

Ms. Carmer informed the EDC that, at the May 21, 2012 meeting, the City Council authorized the City Manager to submit an Economic Revitalization Zone application for the City's Industrial Park at Heritage and Constitution Avenues.

Update on May 21, 2012 Chamber Retail Gathering

Ms. Carmer informed the EDC that she attended the May 21, 2012 Chamber Retail Gathering at Jumpin' Jays Restaurant. Approximately 30 people attended and the Chamber Retail Committee members did an excellent job explaining the value of being a Chamber member.

Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Subcommittee

City Staff have reached out to property owners regarding potential opportunities and are awaiting responses.

Public Comment David Choate reported that current real estate figures are positive and indicate that there has been a significant amount of absorption in the real estate market.

As a follow up to the discussion at last month's meeting on escalating rents in the downtown, Mr. Choate reported that he and some others retailers have discussed speaking to property owners downtown about the negative impact of charging "extravagant rents" as well as working to retain and attract a mix of tenants. This spawned a general discussion about what the city can do as incentives to attract a specific type of business such as a drug store downtown. Mr. Cyr suggested that the EDC invite representatives of Seacoast Local to come to a meeting and discuss crowdfunding for small entrepreneurs or for specific

types of business. Mr. Cohen suggested inviting retailers and restaurateurs to a meeting to learn about their customer base with respect to local patrons versus visitors. Mr. Thorsen spoke about the mechanisms government can use to influence the mix of uses in the downtown.

In order to allow for the Novocure representatives to have enough time for their presentation, it was suggested that this topic should be scheduled for a different meeting and to include the Planning Director.

Confirm Next Meeting: Friday, September 7, 2012

When polled, the Commission expressed interest in a summer on-site visit to another Portsmouth business. Ms. Carmer will explore potential dates in August.

Business presentation and tour of Novocure facility

Mike Ambrogi gave a power point presentation on the company and the medical device it produces for treatment of virulent, solid brain tumors. The device creates tumor treating fields (TTF) which use alternating electrical fields to prevent the splitting of cancer cells. It is an alternative to chemotherapy, radiation and surgery for the treatment of these deadly tumors without the negative side effects. Thus far, it has been used for end stage brain cancer patients and provides roughly the same life expectancy as other treatment modalities. However, the firm has received permission to conduct trials for earlier stage patients which are proving positive.

Novocure is an international company with primary corporate offices and manufacturing facilities in Israel. Portsmouth is home to the US headquarters. The office has 15 employees and the primary functions are order fulfillment, billing and reimbursement, US technology support, quality assurance and US-based human resources. The US operations oncology staff is based in New York City and there is a small product finishing facility in California. The firm plans to hire 10 more Portsmouth-based employees by the end of the year. Typical salaries are in the \$60,000-\$80,000 range. The company chose Portsmouth for its proximity to the Boston medical device industry and for the lower operating costs and quality of life in Portsmouth. The firm is currently funded through venture capital and private equity.

In discussions about what the City can do to help retain and expand Novocure, Mr. Ambrogi responded that a major factor will be finding the skilled workers needed to meet the company's growth plan. Some zoning regulation modifications that allow light assembly and distribution uses in Commerce Way would be essential for them to grow at that location. He said that recruiting other medical device firms would be good for attracting the labor needed to grow these companies. Ms. Carmer suggested exploring a the a job training grant to create a pipeline of qualified workers such as Lonza Biologics has in partnership with Great Bay Community College.

Following the presentation and question and answer session, Mr. Ambrogi provided a tour of the facility.

With no further business the meeting adjourned at 9:20 a.m.

Amendments to City's Code of Ordinances

Attached is a proposed Ordinance for various housekeeping amendments to the City's Code of Ordinances. As you will recall, I brought these items to the attention of the City Manager and City Attorney back in January. The City Council authorized me to work with the City Attorney and City Manager to bring back these amendments that would address these housekeeping amendments.

I am requesting that the City Council allow me to bring back for first reading these amendments at the September 17, 2012 City Council meeting. The City Attorney feels this can be brought forward as one general amendment because they are not significant changes to the ordinances (one public hearing not multiple public hearings).

Therefore, may I request the City Council move to authorize the City Manager to bring back for first reading the attached amendments to the City's Code of Ordinances at the September 17, 2012 City Council meeting.

ORDINANCE

THE CITY OF PORTSMOUTH ORDAINS that the following amendments be made to:

A. That Chapter 1, Article VI – RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS of the Ordinances of the City of Portsmouth be deleted in its entirety;

(Explanation not part of ordinance: Passage of this ordinance would delete department head residency requirement which was ruled unconstitutional by the Court in the early 1980s.)

B. That Chapter 3, Article I, Section 3.111 – HOGS of the Ordinances of the City of Portsmouth be deleted in its entirety;

(Explanation not part of ordinance: Passage of this ordinance would eliminate a provision which allowed the Health Officer to issue permits for the keeping of hogs, "within the compact part of the City".)

C. That Chapter 5, Article I, Section 5.102 – RESIDENTS OF THE CITY of the Ordinances of the City of Portsmouth be deleted in its entirety;

(Explanation not part of ordinance: Passage of this ordinance would remove from the ordinances a requirement that members of the Fire Department, "establish residence anywhere within a ten mile direct line radius of the Central Fire Station" as well as other requirements, all of which have been superseded by collective bargaining.

D. That Chapter 5, Article I, Section 5.103 – AGE LIMIT of the Ordinances of the City of Portsmouth be deleted in its entirety;

(Explanation not part of ordinance: Passage of this ordinance would remove an unused provision which would prevent persons under the age of 21 or over the age of 35 from being, "appointed a permanent fireman" as well as remove an age limitation on the now non-existent call Fire Department.

E. That Chapter 6, Article VI – DANCING of the Ordinances of the City of Portsmouth be deleted in its entirety;

(Explanation not part of ordinance: Passage of this ordinance would eliminate an obsolete licensing provision regarding public dances in the Clty which requires a license; requires a fee; requires the City Manager approve the location of the dance; calls for police attendance at each dance; requires a matron to be, "in charge of the ladies parlor and toilet" and establishes hours when dances are allowed.)

F. That Chapter 9, Article II - SUNDAY ORDINANCES of the Ordinances of the City of Portsmouth be deleted in its entirety

(Explanation not part of ordinance: Passage of this ordinance would eliminate a series of unenforced ordinances which prohibit or limit amateur or professional sports, "moving pictures and theatricals" and certain retail trades on Sunday.

The City Clerk shall properly alphabetize and/or re-number the ordinance as necessary in accordance with this amendment.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby deleted.

This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

As discussed at the last City Council meeting, I am bringing back a request for first reading to be scheduled for September 17, 2012 regarding a high occupancy meter zone in the downtown core that would continue a rate of \$1.50 per hour. All other streets outside of this high occupancy meter zone would be \$1.00 per hour under this recommendation. This was the original recommendation within the Parking and Supply Strategy Report of May 2012.

Simply put, meters that have an average utilization above 85% would be at \$1.50 and those below 85% outside the downtown core would be \$1.00.

The City Manager has provided me with a map of those high occupancy meters along with a listing of streets. Also, attached is a proposed Ordinance that would implement this high demand high occupancy meter zone.

Therefore, may I request the City Council authorize the City Manager to bring back for first reading the attached proposed Ordinance at the September 17th City Council meeting.

ORDINANCE

THE CITY OF PORTSMOUTH ORDAINS

That Chapter 7, Article I, Section 7.102 – PARKING METER ZONES of the Ordinances of the City of Portsmouth be amended to read as follows (deletions from existing language stricken; additions to existing language bolded; remaining language unchanged from existing):

Section 7.102: PARKING METER ZONES

All of those streets, parts of streets and off-street parking lots, the time for parking upon which is limited by any ordinance of the City of Portsmouth, and any such areas the time for parking upon which may at any time hereafter be limited by any ordinance of the City or any amendment thereto are designated as parking meter zones. Parking in parking meter zones at metered-spots upon streets or in off-street metered-lots shall be at the rate of \$1.50 per hour with the for a maximum time permitted for of parking of three (3) consecutive hours, unless otherwise established by ordinance. The rate for such parking shall be:

A. DOWNTOWN HIGH OCCUPANCY ZONE:

Parking shall be at the rate of one dollar fifty cents (\$1.50) per hour in the following areas:

- 1. Daniel Street, starting at Chapel Street through to Market Square
- 2. Bow Street, starting at Chapel Street through to Market Street
- 3. Congress Street, starting at Market Square through to Chestnut Street
- 4. Pleasant Street, starting from Court Street through to Market Square
- 5. Market Street, starting from Moffatt-Ladd House through to Market Square.
- B. Parking in all other parking meter zones shall be at the rate of one dollar (\$1.00) per hour.

The City Clerk shall properly alphabetize and/or re-number the ordinances as necessary in accordance with this amendment.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby deleted.

This ordinance shall take effect as of January 2, 2013.


