WATER PROJECTS BY THE LHS 5th GRADE CLASS: Fifth grade students Frances Dintino, Nathan Edwards, Harry Pont, Isabelle Telford and teacher Molly Green presented a PowerPoint presentation on different water projects completed by Ms. Green's fifth grade class over the past year. The presented water projects morphed out of an article that Ms. Green had read titled "The revenge of water" and resulted in storm drain painting, a "shower challenge", reading a book called *A Long Walk to Water*, participating in an H2O challenge, raising \$700 to help drill a bore hole for a well in the Sudan, and finally visiting the city's waste water treatment plant to better understand the importance of conserving water. At Little Harbour, every graduating class decides on a class gift. The graduating class of 2012 decided to gift a bottle filling station because of their interest in water. In three days alone, the school saved over 300 plastic bottles.

At the end of a 6 year commitment, both schools will re-assess the program.
