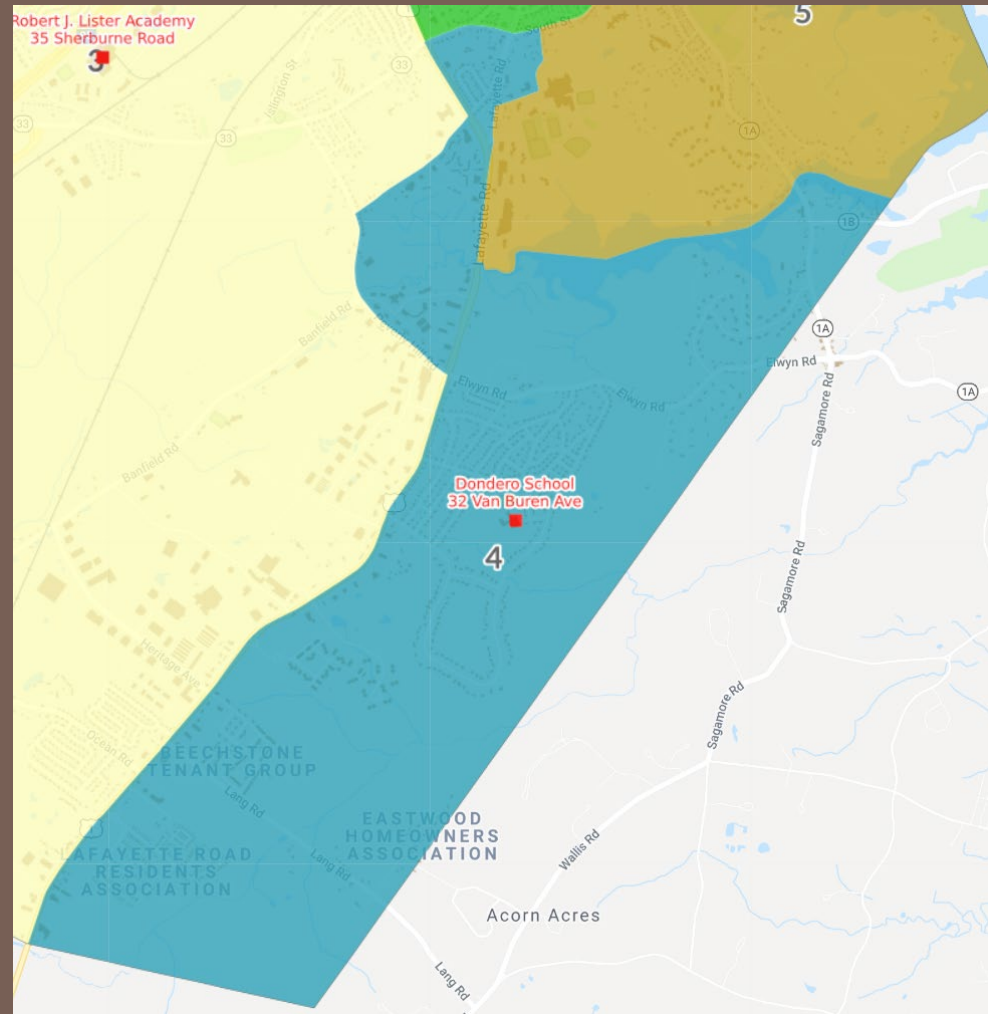

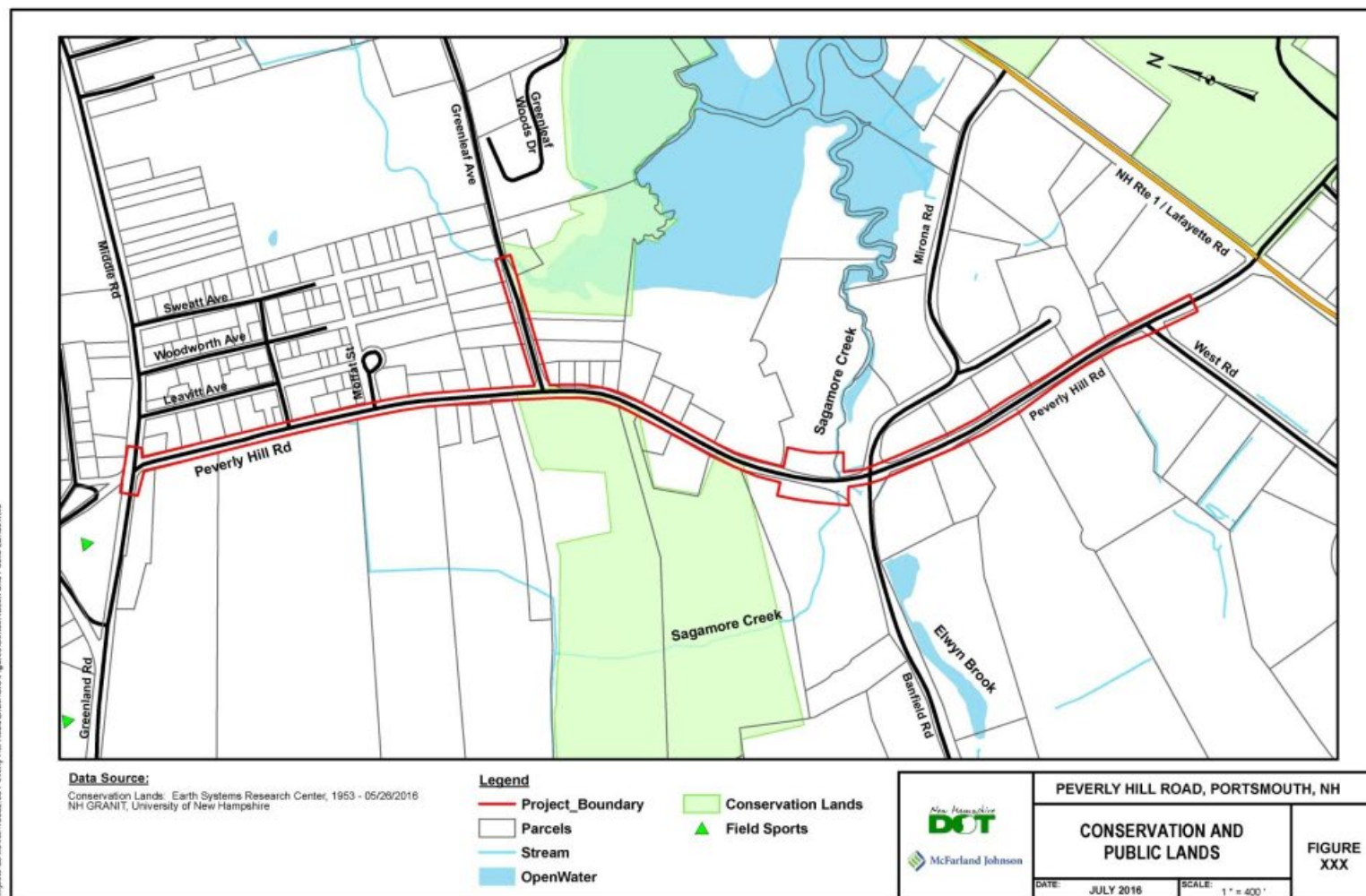

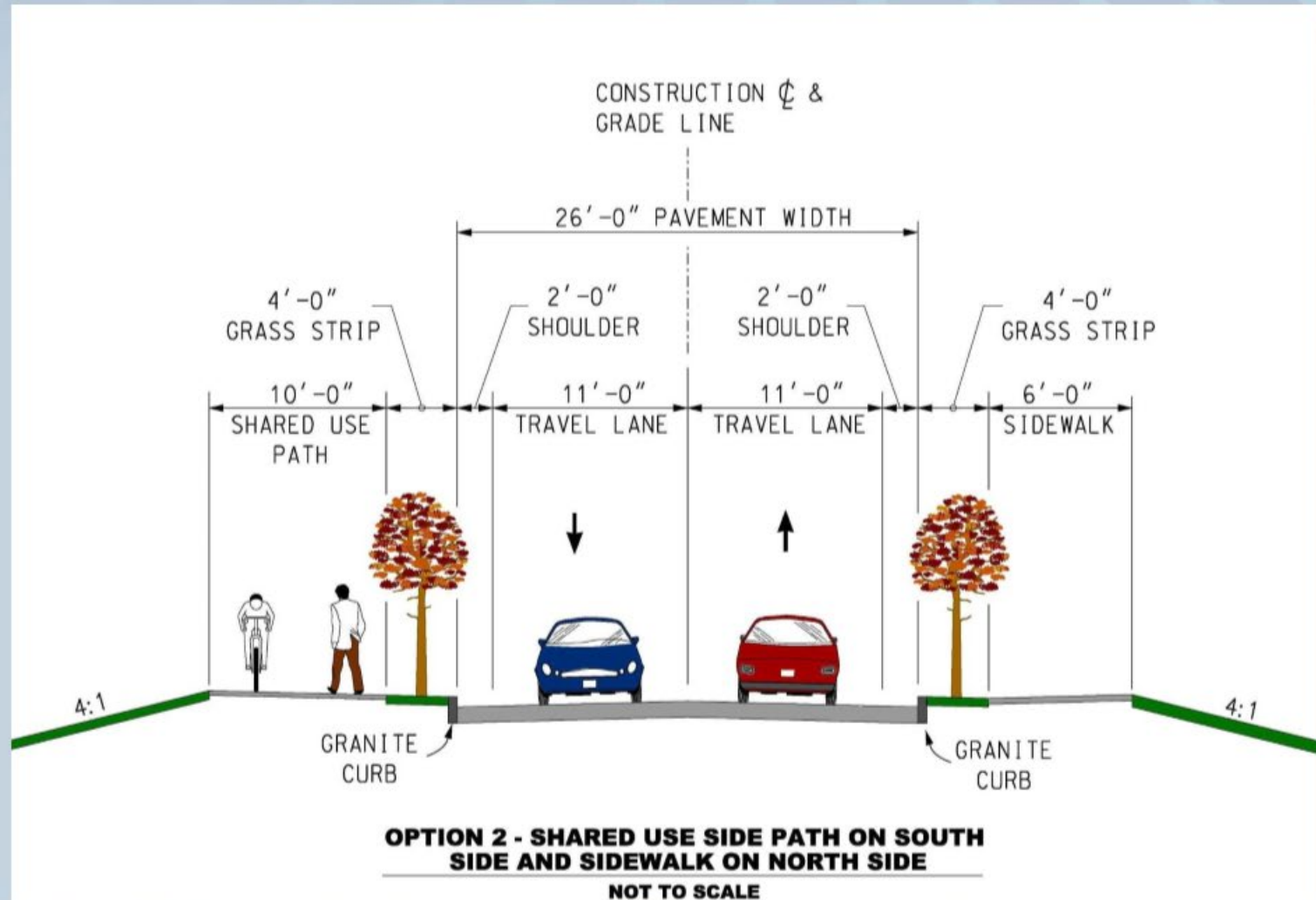


Peverly Hill Road





Preferred Option 2



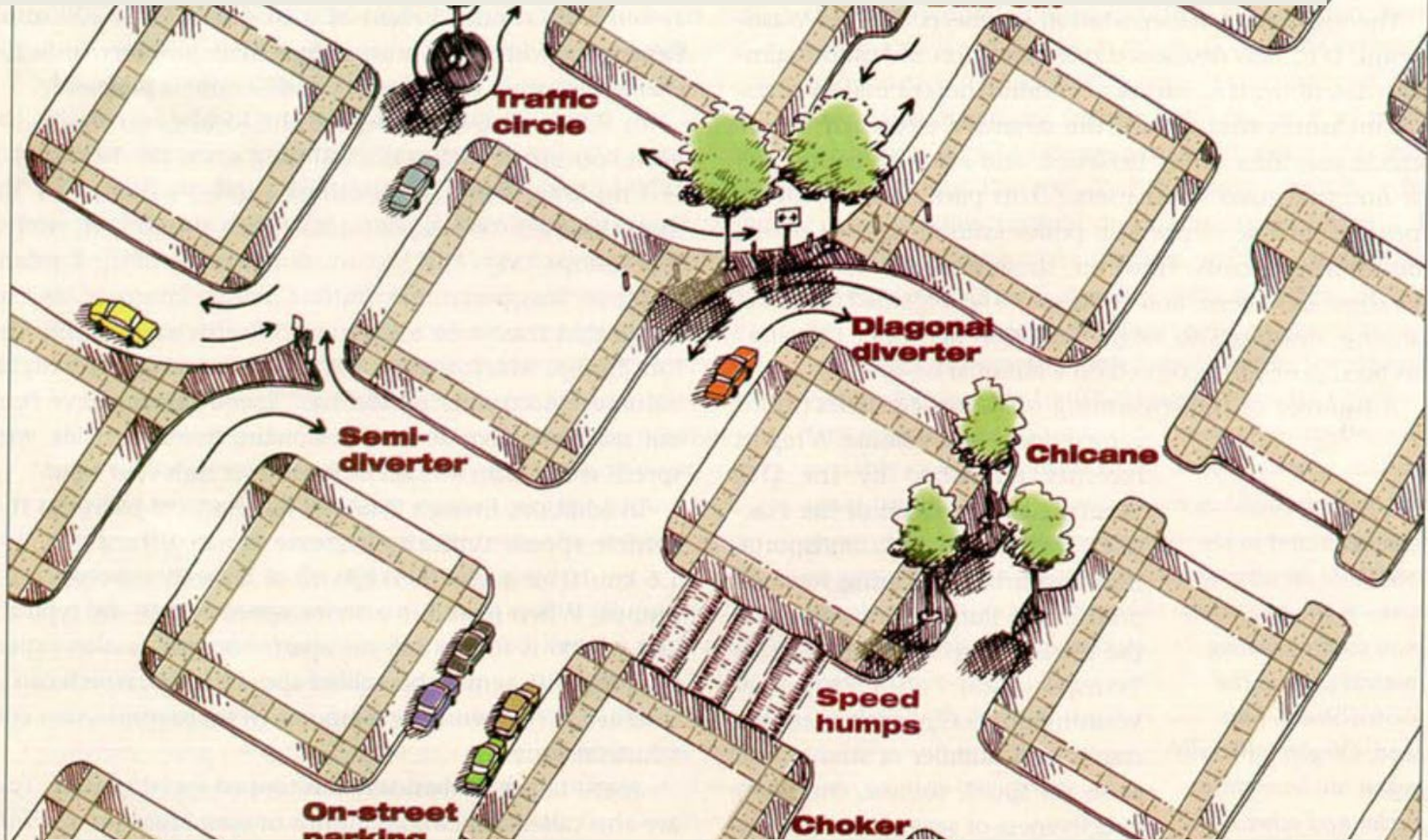

Please submit this application to Eric Eby, Parking and Transportation Engineer (eeby@cityofportsmouth.com) to be considered for the Traffic Calming Program. The following information will help city staff to understand your request. Additional information may be required, including a citizen petition, as applicable.

1. Identify the requested street or area to be considered for traffic calming measures. (Attach a site map if possible).

2. Describe existing traffic issues (speeding, volume, etc.). Please include a description of who is involved (a certain kind of driver, most drivers, etc.), who is affected (pedestrians, homeowners, other drivers, etc.) and the days and/or time of day when the traffic issue is more prevalent.

3. List any neighborhood characteristics that may be pertinent to the traffic issue. Some characteristics may include school and business location with respect to traffic area, use of area by pedestrians or bicyclists, geometry of road, etc.

Community Oriented Traffic Calming Measures

- Street Signs / Pavement Markings (MUTCD compliance required)
- Radar Speed Feedback Sign
- Enforcement
- Parking Management



Physical Traffic Calming Measures

- Vertical Deflections
 - Speed hump
 - Speed table
 - Speed cushion
 - Raised crosswalk
 - Raised intersection
- Horizontal Deflections
 - Neighborhood Traffic circle
 - Curb extension / bulb out
 - Chicane
 - Median Island
- Physical Obstructions
 - Semi-diverter
 - Diagonal diverter
 - Street closures
 - Median island
