- Street Signs / Pavement Markings (MUTCD compliance required)
- Radar Speed Feedback Sign
- Enforcement
- Parking Management



Physical Traffic Calming Measures

- Vertical Deflections
 - Speed hump
 - Speed table
 - Speed cushion
 - Raised crosswalk
 - Raised intersection
- Horizontal Deflections
 - Neighborhood Traffic circle
 - Curb extension / bulb out
 - Chicane
 - Median Island

- Physical Obstructions
 - Semi-diverter
 - Diagonal diverter
 - Street closures
 - Median island
