comments: Dear Councilors,

I am writing to you to encourage you to decide that in Portsmouth we should officially celebrate both Columbus Day and Indigenous Peoples' Day on the same day of October (this year Oct. 11).

Until there is a proclaimed Indigenous People's Day (IPD) either officially in New Hampshire or on the Federal level, it seems to me this would be the best option in our city for a number of reasons:

- Creating a different day to celebrate IPD would bring many complications regarding the closing of offices, time off from work and other issues.
- We all understand that the narratives around both the Columbus explorations and the sometimesromanticized versions of Indigenous People in North and South America were not realistically communicated in earlier historical documents and certainly not in school books. We all need to work on those issues.
- As we now know from more extensive recent narratives from historians, Columbus did not discover America, in fact he did not even set foot in North America (however, he was an explorer of his time, and behaved no differently than other explorers). Viewed with 20th century eyes there was much behavior to condemn during that era in the 15th century. In fact, most people's lives in European countries at the time were miserable and dangerous unless you were powerful and wealthy.
- It is no surprise based on their own history of discrimination in America, that Italian-Americans view Columbus Day as a sign of respect towards their ethnic group; and abolishing it or replacing it is seen by them as a sign of disrespect. At the same time, we must recall that Columbus was not from Italy (that country did not exist at that time) but from Verona, and he was exploring not on behalf of Verona but on behalf of the Spanish Court.
- The history of Indigenous Peoples' in North and South America is also a mixed history, of both tribal warfare including much cruelty against other tribes as well as some collaboration with the explorers to make use of more powerful weapons and techniques that they used to defend and support their own tribes (see "1491" by Charles C. Mann).
- By creating a Columbus/ Indigenous People's Day in Portsmouth, we acknowledge both Italian Americans and Indigenous Peoples without disrespecting either group. Taking sides is very divisive.
- With one common day, Portsmouth residents would be encouraged to celebrate in whatever manner they wish on that day in Oct.
