This water serves the citizens of Portsmouth, New Castle, Rye, Greenland, and Newington. The proposed project will include the installation of a new waterline in between the two existing water lines where they cross Little Bay from adjacent to Wagon Hill Farm in Durham to Fox Point in Newington.

The easement interests to be acquired include a temporary construction easement of $\pm 18,129$ sq. ft. and permanent easement of $\pm 2,453$ sq. ft. fully encompass both the existing water line and the new water line to be installed over the property located at 180 Piscatagua Road in Durham.
