#### A. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Welch summarized his report, including the lease-up of Ruth Lewin Griffin Place which is nearing completion, the Housing Needs Assessment from RKG which will be released in September, and the possibilities for the City to provide property for the PHA to develop new housing. Mr. Welch also reported on the upcoming annual Back to School Bash, the engagement of a Resident Services Program consultant to help PHA prepare for the possibility of an increase in the Resident Services budget from American Rescue Plan and CARES Act funding, and a report on the Chamber Collaborative awards event where PHA received the "Building a Better Community Award."

PHA was a part of a large class action lawsuit with several thousand Housing Authorities across the United States. The Housing Authorities won and the PHA has received \$550,000 which has been deposited to the COCC. The PHA's fee accountant has advised the money to be transferred to the LTD. A memo will be submitted to the Board at the September Board meeting outlining this recommendation, and a vote will be entertained to approve this transfer.

Ms. Labrie presented a new consolidated balance sheet, which the Commissioners appreciated.

Commissioner Bergeron asked if Betty's Dream will be affected from the closing of Crotched Mountain School, since Betty's Dream has a grant from Crotched Mountain to provide aides. Mr. Welch will look into that and report back.
