  - I. Remit SWEPT bills (oppose): **HB 675** (Amended and now only addresses a school tax cap (track); **HB 669** (*ITL*) and HB 739 (*Mayor testified in opposition* before Senate Finance on April 1, 2025)
  - J. Housing bills that have crossed over to Senate (support) HB 342 Approval process for new construction (suggested amendment); HB 457 Occupancy of housing units; HB 572 Partners is Housing (Exec in House on April 1, 2025); HB 577 ADU amendments (City registered in support before Senate Commerce); HB 604 Loan forgiveness for low income homeowners who build ADUs (retained in committee)
