#### V. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Welch summarized his report, including noting that PHA's ROSS grant has been renewed for another three years. PHA has been awarded a grant for a solar array project at Margeson, which will help replace the roof and install a 100kW rooftop system. He expressed gratitude to Revision Energy for their support in applying for the grant. He also highlighted the recent threat to the NHSaves program, which funds energy efficiency projects, and noted that the NH Housing Authorities Corporation is actively advocating to save it.

Mr. Welch discussed the progress of two significant projects, the Christ Church and Sherburne School.

# A. Res 2025-02. Vote on Certificate of Authority RE: Department of Energy Grant
