<p>Portsmouth Climate Action Plan – committee roles – 6:40pm</p>	<p>Presented by Jess and Effie</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Review of slides and context of discussion - Need for formalization of process so we can look back next year and see accomplishments as well as challenges and what decisions were made <p>Bill – does ‘we’ in this context mean the committee or the council or the city as a whole?</p> <p>Effie – we are advising and guiding the council on the CAP</p> <p>Bill – we have a collaborative implementation role as well</p> <p>Peter – there are CAP items for the community as well as city staff and functions</p> <p>Effie – review of CAP roles on sustainability committee</p> <p>Jess – review of CAP committee chart, need for committee to understand context of past sustainability actions like the plastic bag ban</p> <p>Bill – need to identify connectivity between activities and recommendations</p> <p>Colleen – how does the committee relate to non-city advising?</p> <p>Effie/Bill – there is some language in the CAP to encourage this. City buildings have a green building policy</p> <p>Josh – we do not have a statutory role. Could we go to committees that do have this responsibility?</p> <p>Peter – have members attend public meetings, this would be beneficial earlier in the process. Any board that has a public comment session, can also be direct reach out to other boards</p> <p>Bill – there is opportunity for making sure developers and other stakeholders</p> <p>Jess – educating other boards and stakeholders would be valuable</p> <p>Peter – boards are limited and guided by their ordinance in what they can take on from us, vs us just encouraging actions from developers, we need more community engagement</p> <p>Colleen – need development to be long term aligned with the CAP, we need cross priority stakeholder engagement</p>	<p>Presented by Jess and Effie</p> <p>Review of chart and slides</p> <p>Themes and commentary</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Committee members take on the topics and roles that interest them, reflected in the chart - The role of the committee is to advise and guide the council on the CAP. We do not have a statutory role. - There is opportunity for engagement with other boards, staff, and stakeholders. <p>Kate will send out the more comprehensive, internal CAP.</p>

	<p>Josh – C PACE is evolving and could be of interest in this conversation</p> <p>Effie – there are a number of priorities related to transit</p> <p>Josh – there are funds that exist for EV charging infrastructure</p> <p>Bill – the public transit and mode shift items on the chart should be paired. The criteria across the top are good.</p> <p>Effie – further review of chart, agreement on responsibilities</p> <p>Bill – the NH CAP may include city fleet electrification priorities</p> <p>Peter – the planning board is going to look at an amendment to allow for private solar arrays</p> <p>Josh – there are recommended solar array spots for city property. There will be updates at next renewable energy committee.</p> <p>Effie – we should do an updated GHG inventory.</p> <p>Peter – using ICCLI program for GHG inventory is preferred (clearpath). We are not current members but could be.</p> <p>Kate – capital budget request is needed to get an intern or professional to do this</p> <p>Jess – we are right now at a cadence of every five years. Does that need to change?</p> <p>Peter – why exactly do we want to do it? It is not as much of a benchmarking tool but more of a point in time analysis. Many cities have moved away from it because of the amount of change over time in technique and data.</p> <p>Bill – we do it to set a baseline and figure out sources of GHG. We can use it when updating the plan, but there is greater value in monitoring results of plan than trying to capture GHG data. We need more monitoring of CAP success.</p> <p>Bert – there is urgency and a need to scale. The CAP is meant to give us specifics to move us forward. We should have a community climate conversation about the CAP.</p> <p>Bert’s skills relate to helping people understand the CAP.</p> <p>Colleen – mass vs. targeted stakeholder engagement. The committee is good at mass stakeholder engagement and have captured the engaged and aware. What we need now is more direct, facilitated, proactive relationships with primary stakeholders on different selected priorities. Use the partnerships list as a starting point. Emphasis on the interdisciplinary, systemic approach to sustainability.</p>	<p>General agreement on chart layout, with further discussion for the next month.</p>
