October 23rd Sustainability Committee Meeting

- Sept. '25 minutes accepted: Fred 1st, Jess 2nd
- Jess spoke to shared draft of member resources being created to help onboard new members
 - Intended to be internal and a living document
 - Rhianne suggested we add contact information on point people on certain initiatives
 - Torey applauded effort and suggested we add partner community groups and spell out the typical timeline for proposing agenda items, the group decided "at least a week before."
 - Bill to add formal connections, like the Energy Advisory and Conservation Committee.
- EV School Bus Presentation by STA
 - Effie to send thank you with any additional questions from the committee
 - Fred clarified that other school purchases have only happened through grants, and asked for follow-up on the 50k price tag for level 2 chargers.
 pointing to cheaper residential prices
 - Jess brought up questions on the contract mechanism- the school gets the grants 'pays' but STA then owns the bus? Proposal to ask for more details on contract mechanism and get contact information for weare/hannover school contacts
 - Sully pointed to initial cost be too high without a grant and clarified questions from group on parking at the high school= \$150/ year (more at Greek Church down road)
 - Clarification that we currently use STA, not First Student so it would require a new contract- Fred suggests we add "electric school bus availability" to the future RFP
 - Torey proposed that any members bringing in speakers that are businesses the member can make a quick statement in the name of "business transparency" so the focus can be on the content

• Community Climate Conversations

- Community conversation will be on a radio talk show (WSCA) Nov. 19th- an interview with SeacoastCAN (Seacoast Climate Action Now)
- Next steps to implement Cap topic proposed after CIP and November process
- o Explore a topic on the masterplan?
- Effie looking for volunteer to refresh the city website page
 - Fred asked about adding onboarding resource- Torey and Bill pointed to the internal nature of the document and Jess commented she used much of the website content to build the resource
 - Process is to draft changes- vote on them in committee- and kate updates site
 - Conversation around the navigation to sustainability committee being challenging- proposed we move to under the "boards" tab
 - o Proposal to leverage slide from city council presentation w/ updates
 - Fred wondering if Colleen may be a good person to help with this?

CAP: Committee Action Spreadsheet

- Jess asked committee if this is still helpful- Bill and other emphasized that's it's a great way to stay organized and prioritize actions including the four CIP proposals.
- Clarified this cant be a shared doc (quorum issues) so you must reach out to Kate, Effie or Jess to update
- Decided to keep it as a standing item to review in meetings

Capital Meeting:

- Torey & Bill gave a review of the process and general response to speaking to CIP items proposed
- Bill shared that the microtransit item was on last year but not budgeted, and that he spoke to this, and it seems to have been accepted.
- Torey spoke to GHG Inventory and said that it had been deemed a "non-CIP" item, but emphasized that it would be good to have additional resources to improve the quality of the inventory. Also mentioned that in many cases, these are a prerequisite for climate grants.
- Torey also spoke to the solar arrays with a response that the city had already done a review of municipal buildings, but the committee encouraged that non-building city property also be studied.
- o Torey spoke about a study on municipal EVs, and it seemed to be accepted
- Conversation about following meeting opportunities to speak in support of CIP items

Masterplan

- o Jess called to engage via the online portal or the poster boards in the city hall.
- Jess also shared the timeline of a draft at some point near EOY- open question on timing.

Energy Advisory

- Landfill PV feasibility study being presented Nov. 5th on methodology and process.
- Clarified that municipal building energy is not purchased through
 Portsmouth power because it is purchased in large purchase agreements Josh has clarified that he has advocated for the city to buy EACs in past.

NH CAP

- Bill shared that the NH CAP is accepting final comments. It explicitly avoids calling for policy changes and new funding programs.
- Also, there is a concern that it does not seem to be shared or adopted into the department plans.
- Ask the group to review the NH CAP recommendations.

CAP Implementation

- The Committee discussed the action of conducting research to support CAP implementation and including that as part of the Committee's official mission.
